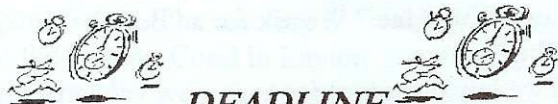

December:

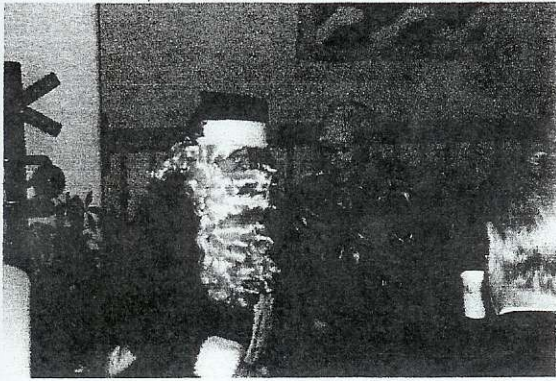

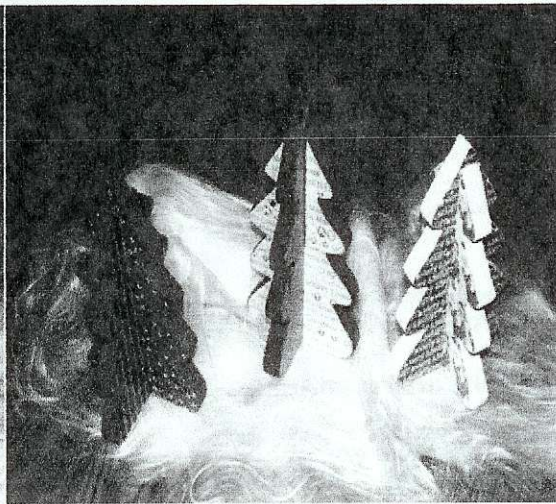
