

DECEMBER






DECEMBER



DECEMBER, 2012



We had a drawing for monthly host couples. It will be another enjoyable year that we all look forward to.




DECEMBER


We have come to the conclusion that the chapter will have to be more flexible to accommodate our members. New ways to do this are being explored and if anyone has any really good ideas, please share!!






DECEMBER






DECEMBER






