


SEPTEMBER

We heard suggestions for which organization will receive our charity money. A final vote will decide this item at our November meeting.




We dearly missed the absence of our "snowbirds" that have left us for warmer climates; however we were happy to have several guests join us for dinner.


OCTOBER

with duct tape and we had some really fun, unique designs to say the least. We enjoyed a fun evening of games and prizes and found out just how good a golfer Harold is.






OCTOBER

SEPTEMBER




SEPTEMBER
