We wish a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year to everyone.




# NOVEMBER






# JANUARY

We had a good turnout at Chuck A Rama for our November Cooks Night Out. The food was good and the company was even better.


# DECEMBER

We held our Holiday Dinner at the Giles' home in Perry. Doris cooked the entire dinner which was far better than any restaurant.


As a Chapter we brought items and donated them to the Angel Tree program in Box Elder County.

#### DECEMBER




# DECEMBER


I know that we get caught up in our winter meetings and what goes on there but would you as the reader, would you like a little more? Let the editor know your desires by writing a note to her.


#### DECEMBER


#### DECMEBER


#### DECEMBER
